SINGLE EVENT MEMBERSHIP IS NOT ACCEPTABLE AT AHA REGIONAL OR NATIONAL COMPETITIONS. EXHIBITORS IN WALK-TROT CLASSES ARE EXEMPT FROM AHA MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS AT QUALIFYING COMPETITIONS, BUT MUST HAVE AN AHA MEMBERSHIP WITH COMPETITION CARD AT AHA REGIONAL AND NATIONAL COMPETITIONS. Entry Procedures: An entry form must be completed for each show and horse/rider combination. Entries will be filled on a first come, first served basis based on RECEIPT. Entries must be received or completed and paid online by midnight December 14, 2023. Do not send entries requiring a delivery signature or a post entry fee will be charged. Please use the entry form contained in this Prize List or from the CARA website at http:// www.caradressage.com. Send the completed entry form, copies of all cards and registrations and all fees to the Show Secretary. Make checks payable to Central Arizona Riding Academy. Vaccination records must be available for examination per USEF GR845. An entry is incomplete without proof of memberships and horse registrations and will be charged internet search fees. Online entries are strongly suggested via https://eqentries.com (See below). *Paper entries add \$15 per show.*

By signing the entries, Riders competing on more than 2 horses, agree that they may have less than 50 minutes between rides on different horses. The signature is agreement in writing per USEF DR126.2.b.5.

Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org. No refunds will be given if competitor cannot provide proof of completion. COVID-19 restrictions, if any, will apply to all participants (competitors, grooms, volunteers, and staff).

STABLING

Stabling has various combinations. If you have any questions about this, please call Dian Seabury at 520-906-5545.

Entering Champagne Arabian/HA/AA ONLY: nothing special is required; just pick which stabling option you want—Day Stall, Haul in or Wednesday night only.

Entering Champagne Arabian/HA/AA AND Champagne I: fill out two entries (Champagne Arabian, AND Champagne I) and select either Haul In or put your stabling on the Champagne I entry. Add Wednesday night stabling to the Champagne I entry. Entering Champagne Arabian/HA/AA AND Champagne I AND II: fill out three entries (Champagne Arabian, AND Champagne I AND II) and select either Haul in or Thursday-Sunday stabling on Champagne I and II entry and add Wednesday night to the I and II entry.

Stabling will be in the annex barns. Stabling in the Premium barn is limited and will be awarded on a <u>first come, first served</u> basis and reserved for Entrants in the weekend Champagne I and II shows (See sponsorship page on website <u>www.caradressage.com</u> for exceptions to the first come, first served rule). Entry is complete and logged when entry and payment are RECEIVED. Stabling for Day stall, Wednesday night only, Thursday night only or Champagne II only will be in Annex stabling. Horses entered in BOTH Champagne I (competing or schooling) and Champagne II are eligible for Premium barn stabling. Entrants in Champagne Arabian who are also entered in Champagne I and II are eligible for the Premium barn. Please put your stabling on Champagne I entry and add Wednesday stabling.

Stable Groups: If you want to be stabled with a group, please provide the Show Secretary with only ONE name (either individual or Trainer barn) for entire group. Inform the show secretary of stabling requirements when submitting entries (i.e., stallions). Barns wishing to stable together must submit entries early or together. If the Premium barn fills, additional horses, regardless of their stabling preference, will be in the Annex barns. Entries received after the Premium barn is full may not be stabled with their group. Covid-19 restrictions may require stabling to be spread.

- Late Entries with stabling location requests will be honored, if possible. However, late entries may not be stabled with their requested group after barn charts have been finalized and submitted to the venue.
- Smoking is prohibited in stall areas. Use sharps containers provided in barns. Competition management may fine any
 individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other
 sharp disposable instruments. Bio-hazard medical waste containers will be provided in the stable area. All competitors
 and their agents are responsible for proper disposal of this waste.

Prices apply to Horse or Tack Stall. All horses on site overnight must be stabled. Stalls will not be reserved until payment is received by the Show Secretary. The barn manager will not be onsite until Wednesday AM. No one will be available to assist Tuesday arrivals and arenas may not be available for riding.

Stabling options and fees

Premium Barn has 12x12 matted stalls with doors, 12 ft solid walls between stalls. Overnight stabling only. Annex Stabling has 10x10 stalls with doors. Overnight or day stall options. No outside bedding is permitted and 2 bags are included. Bedding is required.

Bedding: Shavings may be ordered at \$14 per bag and will be delivered to your assigned stall. Indicate the number of bags on entry form. Bedding will be available for purchase during the show beginning on Wednesday pm. No outside bedding permitted. 2 bags of bedding will be included with stabling including tack stall; 1 bag for day stall.

Class List: Use the Class List below.

Registration Requirements: All purebred Arabian and Half Arabian/Anglo Arabian horses to be shown must have been issued a certificate of registration from the AHA Registry and/or the Canadian Arabian Horse Registry (CAHR) or the Canadian Part bred Arabian Register (CPAR), or if under one year of age, be eligible for registry, and registration applied for and must be entered under their full registered name.

Dress: USEF DR120 for Dressage. USEF WD 123 for Western Dressage. If you have any questions about dress, please ask the Steward.

Tests: <u>https://www.usdf.org/competitions/competitors/tests.asp</u> Effective 12/1/2022 for Dressage. We will use current FEI tests. Tests are available on the FEI website, fei.org. Western Dressage Tests are available on https://www.westerndressageassociation.org/wdaa-tests.

Scratches: Scratches before the closing date may be made for any reason and all fees will be refunded except the Office Fee. Competitors have the responsibility to inform the **show office** of their intention to scratch. Anyone who does not appear for their scheduled dressage test without informing the **show office** prior to the scratch will be considered a "no-show" and subsequent rides may be scratched and filled from the wait list.

Late/Post Entries: Accepted as space allows. Add \$30 per entry. See **Stabling** section for late entry stabling information. After the competition is filled, a wait list will be established.

Changes in horse or rider: see entry fees above

Not Competing (Schooling) Horses: Must pay a \$30 schooling fee, office fee and fill out entry.

RV or LQ Trailer Hookups: Please contact facility at 480-358-3793 to reserve a space. If arriving before Wednesday MUST be approved through show. Additional fees may apply.

Parking: Trailers must be parked in designated areas.

Ride Times: Preliminary ride times and a show schedule will be available on the Fox Village Ride Times and Results website <u>https://www.foxvillage.com/Results</u> and CARA website, <u>http://www.caradressage.com</u>. Final ride times will be posted at the show by Noon Wednesday for Champagne Arabian, by noon Thursday for Champagne I and Friday for Champagne II. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to verify final ride times at the show. Please notify the show secretary of any scheduling conflicts. Ride times will not be mailed.

Arenas: Both uncovered or covered competition and warm-up arenas (sand mix). All tests are ridden in 20 x 60m arenas. Arenas will be open for schooling on Wednesday. During the show, competition arenas will be open for hand walking only outside the dressage court up to one half hour prior to the start of the first class, and mounted schooling after close of competition until show office closes. Arenas will be watered and worked throughout the show.

Pets: All pets must be on a leash per USEF GR1301.6 or subject to fine. No pets inside arena fencing at any time. Loose dogs will be captured, and owner must pay \$50 which will be donated to the Arizona Humane Society.

Concessions: Available on grounds.

Numbers: Two numbers will be provided for each horse. All horses on the show grounds must have a number on when out of their stalls.

Awards: First place Prize and ribbon for Open, AA and Jr/YR divisions. Ribbons awarded through 6th place. Test of Choice class placing will be determined by division, by percentage ranking, regardless of which test is ridden within each class. Ties broken per USEF DR 123.3 and 123.8.

Arrival Day(s): All USEF and local rules are in effect upon entering show grounds including arrival day(s).

Directions: *From Tucson*: Take exit 211 from I-10 W, Take AZ-87 N, N Attaway Rd, N Hunt Hwy, N Gantzel Rd and W Empire Blvd to East Riggs Road. *From Phoenix:* US-60 E to Mesa. Use the right 2 lanes to take exit 190B for Arizona 202 S, Take exit 34A for AZ-24 E, Continue on S Ellsworth Rd. Drive to East Riggs Rd. The facility is located on the north side of Riggs Road between Hawes and Ellsworth roads.

Golf Cart Rental: Wednesday through Sunday Rental. 2 Passenger \$250. You may reserve a golf cart by including payment with show entries and informing the Show Secretary. Refer to USEF GR1301.7 published in full below. After the close date, contact Show Manager by one week prior to the show to ensure availability. Cancellation of golf cart reservations not accepted after we finalize the number of carts to be delivered to the show.

Operation of Motorized Vehicles: USEF GR1301.7 applies. Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Other: Show management reserves the right to make changes including, but not limited to, cancel, split or combine classes, limit class size, change arenas, limit the number of rides and number of horses per rider and cancel, add or change judges. The show committee reserves the right to refuse any entry for cause. Show management reserves the right to deny entry to any competitor if the competitor or owner has outstanding debt to CARA. EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF OR FEI RULES AND WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH. It is the responsibility of the competitor to be familiar with these rules. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the show management whose decision shall be final. Every horse entered for competition will comply with the rules of the horse show management, but management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold this horse show and the officials and employees of the show blameless for any loss or accident to his horse, employees, equipment, which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise. The management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disgualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit entries and cancel award prizes without claims for damages; to cancel or combine unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges. Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges or officials, on the part of the owner, manager, rider, or groom shall disgualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit his entry fee and other fees. Show management reserves to itself the power to prohibit any person from attending or showing a horse in the ring and to remove any groom or horse from the show without being liable for compensation. In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act, which restricts the disposal of medical waste, bio-hazardous medical waste containers will be provided in the stable area. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste. No person will be allowed in the show ring during the time of judging except the exhibitor and those having official or requested duties to perform. It is the tradition of the show that riders be

correctly attired for the class in question, that attendants be neatly dressed and the horses properly presented. Management may in its discretion bar any person from entering the ring if not suitable presented to appear before an audience.

USEF Membership Statement: Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes

Disease Outbreak Rule: In the face of a disease outbreak, the show committee reserves the right to follow the AVMA (American Veterinary Medicine Association) and/or the AAEP (American Association of Equine Practitioners) recommendations as to what testing would be necessary to consider a horse free from the disease in question. They also reserve the right to require written proof that said testing has been performed within the recommended period of time. If the competitor does not adhere to the requirements, the show committee can refuse entrance to the show.

Some diseases are "Reportable Diseases", meaning they must be reported to the State of Arizona Department of Agriculture. These diseases are subject to quarantine rules of the state. An example of one such disease is Vesicular Stomatitis. In the case of reportable diseases, a health certificate is required from an accredited veterinarian with proper statement regarding said disease to accompany the horse.

Since this rule could apply to any number of diseases, and it would be impossible to list them all here, the show committee will post the testing/health certificate requirements on the sponsor web page if there is a current disease outbreak in the area.

Headgear Rule: From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, mounted participants in exhibition classes and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. Unless jackets are waived, while in the competition ring, exhibitors wearing protective headgear must wear a short, dark jacket, dark tailcoat (only permitted for tests above Fourth Level), or Armed Services or police uniform (if eligible), dark hat covers (where applicable) and must otherwise conform to DR120.

ATTENTION COMPETITORS

Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with the following association numbers before the day(s) of the competition.

- United States Equestrian Federation (USEF) for horse, owner, rider, trainer and/or coach.
- United States Dressage Federation (USDF) for horse, owner and rider. The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.

and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors,, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States with a membership of nearly 30,000 members, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.
